PE Lesson

Skill: Bouncing a ball

Warm up: Bounce with two hands, then collect/catch with two hands. Repeat.

Bounce and move with two hands. Think about where you should be looking-ahead of you! Experiment with different heights of the bounce. What do you need to do to make the ball go higher? How about lower?

Follow the leader game: Can your child bounce their balls at the same height as you? Try bouncing whilst sitting or kneeling. Change slowly or quickly. This encourages children to look up and be aware. Move to bouncing the ball with one hand, then the other. Try with alternating hands.

Activity: Hit the spot! Place out flat marker spots or hoops. Children bounce their ball using two hands on a spot/in a hoop to gain one point. How many points can they score in one minute? Discuss good technique. Demonstration. Repeat. Can they beat their score? Play again but this time children bounce their balls to move from spot/hoop to spot/hoop. Encourage children to look up, looking for spaces, accuracy of the bounce and catch. STEP- bounce with one hand, then the other; less dominant hand.
