Reading

English

Can you orally rehearse the story of the Three Little Pigs using the story map? See the story map on the website to help you.

Maths

Warm up: Rapid recall of addition facts: 1+1, 1+2, 1+3, 1+4, 1+5

Watch <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=poJmS5iWfEs> Farmer Pete has ten sheep.

"Farmer Pete, he had 10 sheep, over in the pen. 10 were safe and 0 had gone, 10 add 0 makes 10.

Oh dear said Pete, where is my sheep, there's 9 here in the pen. 9 are safe and 1 has gone, 9 add 1 makes 10... etc."

Re-enact the song together using toys or figures.

Can you write the correlating number sentence e.g. $9 + 1 = 10$

Phonics

Recall the sounds: sh, ch, th, ng, ai, ee, igh, oo, ar.

Introduce the sound: 'or' encourage children to use sound buttons to read the following words: for, fork, cord, sort, born, worn, fort, torn.

Read the captions: Can you get the fork? A baby chick was born on the farm. Can you sort the books? I have worn a hat. The dress was torn.

Science -Materials

We use certain materials for certain things because they have to be *suitable*. Suitable means that they suit the object for its purpose. For example, we wouldn't make a table out of Play-Doh as it needs to be a material that is hard. Play-Doh is soft and bendy, and as soon as we lean on the table it would just break! It would not be suitable. A material like wood is suitable as it is hard and sturdy.

Explore a range of materials (maybe the recycling!) and sort them based on their properties.

Can we think like a scientist and decide why that material is strong for example, what could it be used for?
