Could you be inspired by Ntombephi Ntobela?



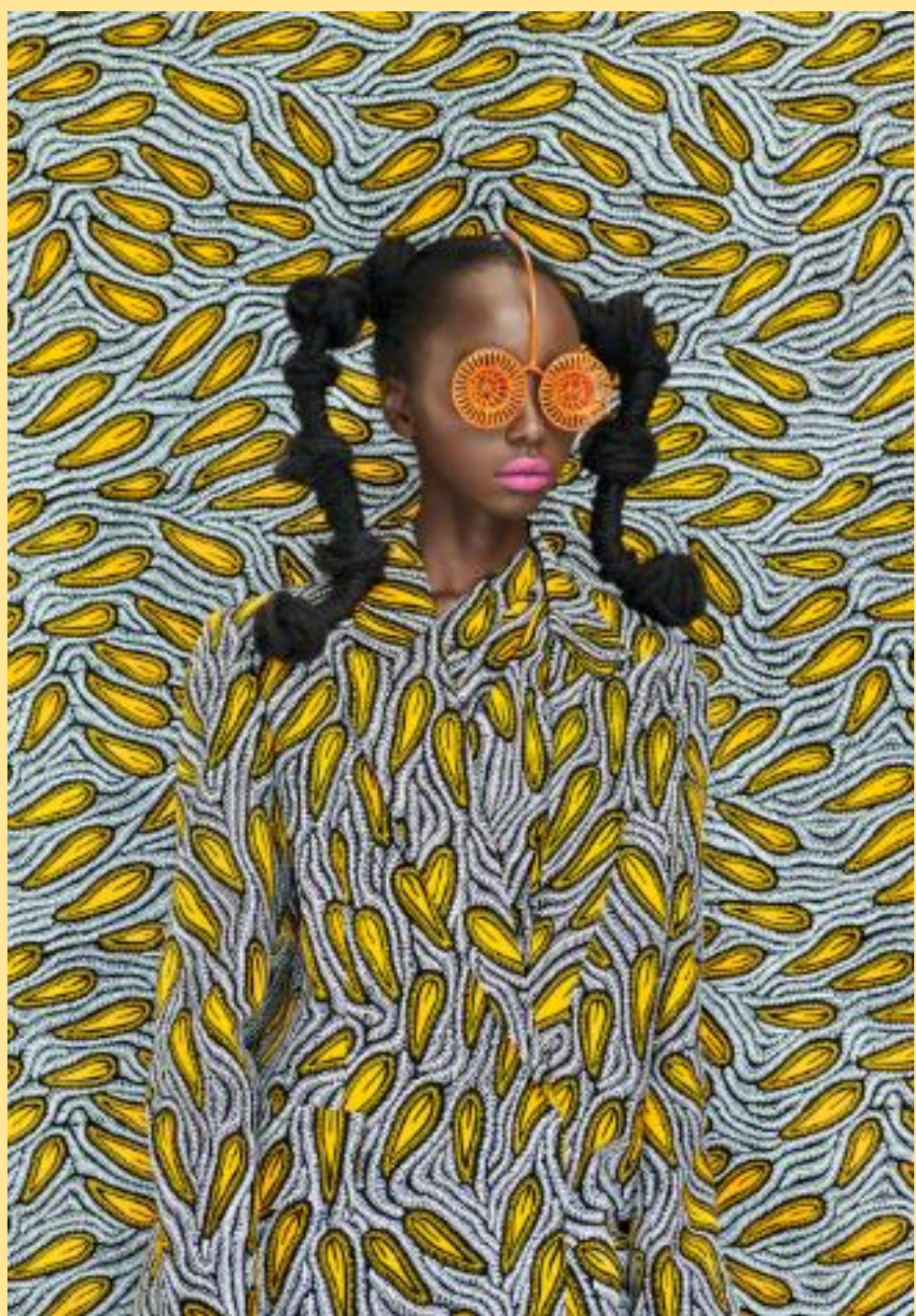
You could make a picture of something from nature by using lots of dots. You could use pens, pencils or crumpled up bits of paper.
