

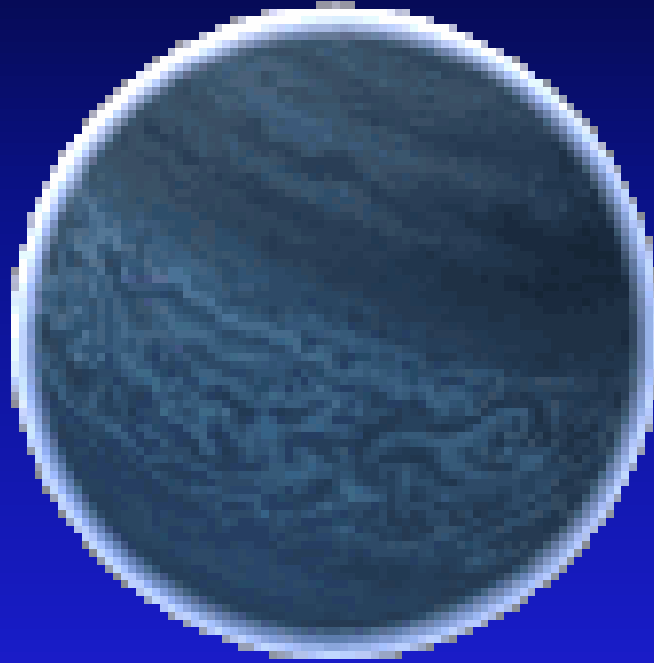
In the Beginning

This was the end of the second day.

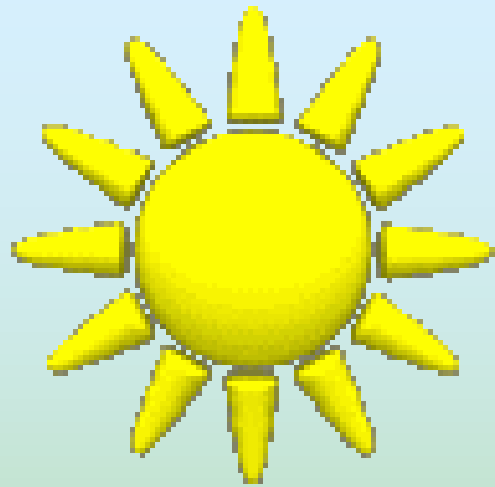
A blue sky with three grey clouds and a blue ocean with white-capped waves.
