HOME LEARNING

Reading – Children should aim to read for 15-20 daily. This may be reading to an adult or independent reading. Please record reading in the green reading record.

Spelling – This week we have been investigating the different spellings for the 'n' sound. Your spellings this week are: **gnome, knew, train, winning, sign**

Maths – Activities will be set on MyMaths each week to follow up in class learning or revisit key skills. Children should spend no longer than 30 minutes per week on these tasks. This week, there are tasks based on fractions to recap prior knowledge, which will help consolidate current learning on unit fractions.

Times tables – Times tables are key to so many areas of maths so we would like the children to try to spend a little bit of time practising regularly – every day if possible! This could be 5 minutes on Ttrockstars, quick-fire questions, games such as tables bingo, or any other way you can think of to practise!
