School website The GALLERY page has been reorganised and there is now a section for each year group so don't forget to have a look each week to see some of the things we have been getting up to in our learning.

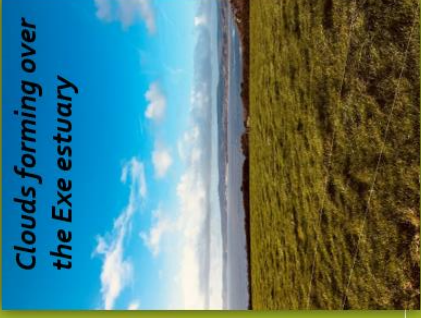

This competition is to encourage our pupils to explore the land around them.

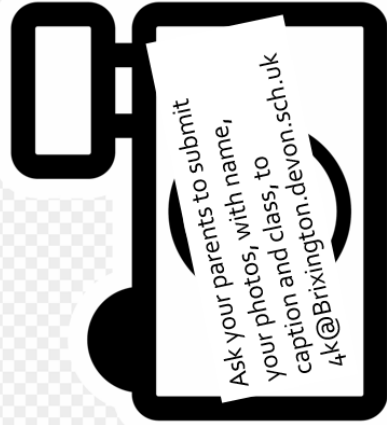
To take part, children should photograph an aspect of physical geography and explain it in a caption

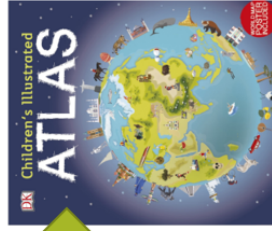
The theme for this competition is
