HOME LEARNING

Reading – We are trying our best to promote a LOVE OF READING in year 3 and would encourage all of the children to bring in a book for pleasure that they can leave in their trays for this half term. The children will be encouraged to read this book a couple of times each week. Children are continuing to bring home reading books. Children should aim to read at home for 15-20mins daily. Please continue to ask your children questions about their books.

You can use any of the questions below to help:

- Look at the front cover. What could the book be about?
- Who is the author?
- What is an illustrator? What do they do?
- Who are the main characters?
- What do you think will happen next?
- How do you think that character feels? Why?
- Can you predict how the book will end?

This term we will begin a set spelling list. These words will be tested in class. Please see the spelling document in the year 3 folder for future spellings as well as an explanation of the colours and ideas you could try.

Maths – This week, please see the MyMaths website for your child's maths focused home learning (some focus on 3s and 4 times tables). Or you could try some of these on scarp paper at home following on from this week's learning:

Example:

465 =

100 + 100 + 100 + 100 (4 x 100)

10 + 10 + 10 + 10 + 10 + 10 (6 x 10)

1 + 1 + 1 + 1 + 1 (5 x 1)

Now try:

785 287 678 423 678 999

Times tables – Year 3 are continuing to focus on the 5 times table. If your child is confident in the 5 times tables, try missing number multiplications. $6x?=30$ or $? \times 5=30$ to complete these tasks, they are entirely optional.

Optional extra: In science this half term we will be looking at forces and magnets. Go on a hunt around your house and discover what is magnetic and what isn't. Record your findings (poster, paper, PowerPoint, video)

Children should spend no more than 30mins per week on these tasks.
