Word of the Day

Each day in class, we focus on one 'Word of the Day'. These words are chosen in order to support children developing a wider vocabulary, help them access a text being used in reading lessons and encourage adventurous word choice when writing.

Next week, year 1/2 will be focusing on the following words:

Perhaps your child will use some of these in conversations at home!

HOME LEARNING

Reading – Children should aim to read at home for 15-20mins daily. This may be reading to an adult or independent reading. Please record reading in the reading record.

Maths –

Year 1 – Please practise adding and subtracting within 20. Challenge your children to any addition and subtraction within 20 (e.g. $18 - 5$ $10 + 2$). If your children manage to whizz through this then you could come up with some worded problems (e.g. Fred had 3 sweets and mummy had double the amount as Fred. How many sweets did they have altogether?)

Year 2 – We continue to practise all of our maths skills through a range of SATS style questions, revising and recapping different strategies. Please see a practise paper which is on the website that you can try any of the questions with your child.

Optional Extras – In computing we have been learning about input and output. Can they explore at home what devices are inputs and what are outputs.

PHONICS FOCUS:

Year 1 please can you continue to work on learning words from the year 1 common exception word list (See attached below)

Year 2 have been looking at homophone words – Can you think of any more there might be and practise their different spellings.
